



C-2 SUMMER RESIDENT CAMP BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES AND REGULATIONS

The signature of parents or guardians and the child are required on this form. These guidelines should be reviewed with the camper before arrival. These rules address behavior which the staff feels is unacceptable and may result in some sort of consequences from verbal warning to removal from camp. This list is not intended to cover every behavior that might result in consequences. If a camper's actions are detrimental to the health and safety of him/herself or others, the director and staff will take appropriate actions.

1. Camper health and safety are important and any activities which negatively affect the health or safety of campers will not be permitted and may result in the camper being removed from activities and possibly sent home.
2. Campers should respect the property of the other campers, staff, and Mohican School. Theft or destruction of property may result in the camper being sent home and restitution required of parents for damaged or lost property.
3. Campers are expected to be prompt and to follow the announced schedule. Lateness is unfair to other campers who want to get the most of the scheduled event. Campers must attend all scheduled activities unless excused in writing by a counselor.
4. Campers are expected to keep their area clean and organized. Each camper will be assigned a community responsibility or job to help keep the camp clean and safe.
5. Campers must follow the directions of all staff members and counselors. Refusal to follow directions and safety procedures will not be tolerated. If a camper feels directions are unreasonable or unfair he/she should follow the directions and then discuss the concern with the counselor or camp director. Repeated insubordination may result in the camper being sent home.
6. Rest and sleep are very important because of the amount of physical activity. Campers are expected to take advantage of rest periods and also stay in their dorms after "lights out".
7. Campers must report to a staff member any accident or injury and an accident report will be completed.
8. The following items are **not** permitted in camp: knives, hatchets, any type of weapon, razors, comic books, electronic games and devices, radios, walkmans, cell phones, pocket TVs, aerosol spray cans, illegal drugs, tobacco, and any other dangerous weapons or objects, or anything that would disrupt the community life and safety of the camp. These items, if found, will result in confiscation and will result in possible loss of privileges and removal of the camper.

Weapons, illegal drugs, being under the influence of drugs and/or alcohol, assault, and any other criminal acts will result in the notification of the sheriff, notification of parents, and removal from camp.

9. All medicines, prescription or non-prescription, must be in the possession of the camp staff. No medicine of any kind should be in the camper's possession, with the exception of emergency medication, and **only** if the signed form has been completed and is on file.
10. Campers must treat each person at the camp with respect. Any form of harassment, physical or verbal, will not be tolerated. Campers should report any concerns about their treatment to a staff member.
11. Campers will have no need for cash during the week. Also, gum, candy, and other food should not be brought to camp. The menu should provide plenty of food.
12. Campers will not be allowed to make phone calls during the week. If a camper needs to contact parents, it should be discussed with a staff member. Parents will be called in case of an accident, illness, or other emergency.
13. Campers should always use the "buddy system" while at camp. A camper should always be with at least one other camper. Do not go anywhere by yourself. In this way, if you become injured or need any help, you will have someone with you.
14. Campers should be concerned about the health and safety of all fellow campers. Campers should report any behavior which violates these rules or which may cause injury or harm to themselves or others. Names of campers who make such reports shall be held confidential as much as possible but may be used if a police report is needed.
15. Campers who drive their personal vehicle will not be permitted to use their vehicle for any reason during camp. Keys are to be given to the camp director and kept in his/her possession until the conclusion of camp.
16. Campers must be picked up by parent and/or legal guardian by the agreed upon time. Campers who have provided their own transportation may not take another camper home without written permission from the other camper's parents and/or legal guardian.

The decision of the camp director shall be final without appeal
